## Giant

Pull-Down Book

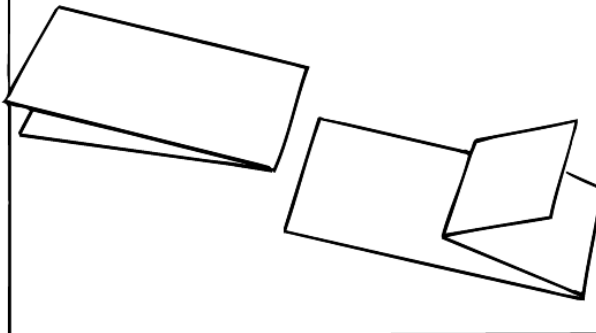
### Materials

- 6" x 18" (13 x 45.5 cm) piece of blue construction paper
- 4 1/2" x 17" (11.25 x 43 cm) sheet of drawing paper
- giant drawing steps on page 52
- writing form on page 53
- scissors and glue
- crayons or felt pens
- stapler
- 5 2" (5 cm) red circles

Fold the drawing paper.



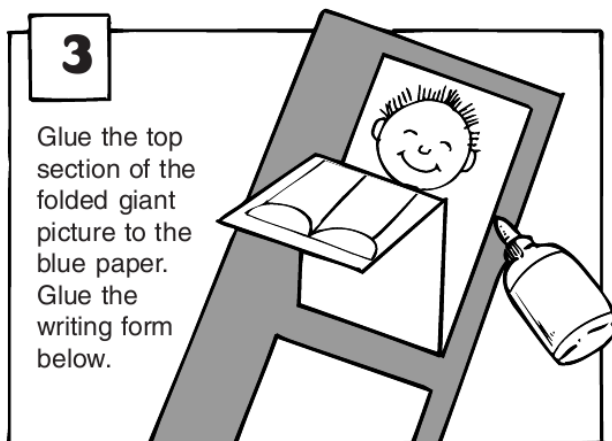
**2**

Draw and color the giant.



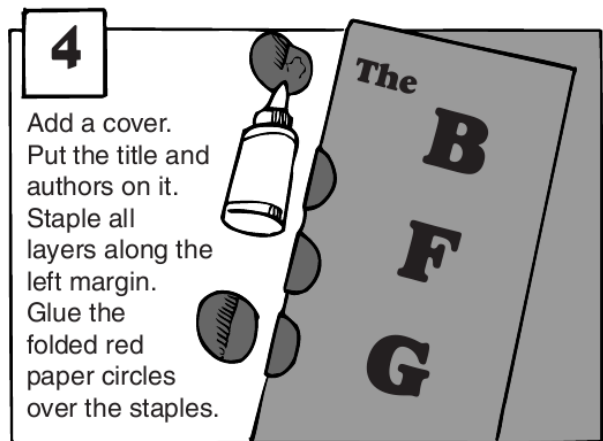
**3**

Glue the top section of the folded giant picture to the blue paper. Glue the writing form below.

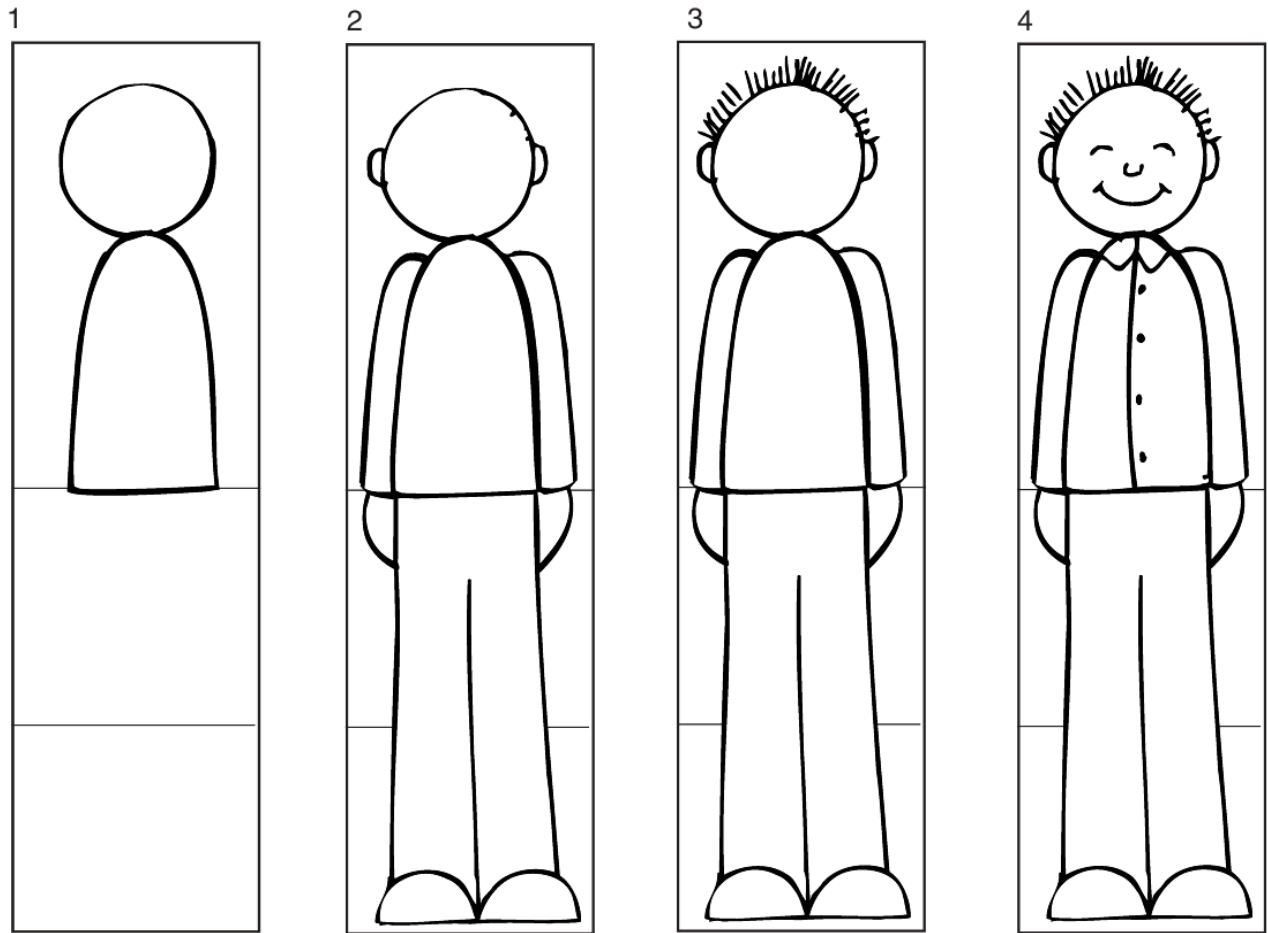

Add a cover. Put the title and authors on it. Staple all layers along the left margin. Glue the folded red paper circles over the staples.
